# A Note from you Club Historian

FROM THE MAY 1990 issue of "The Bay Area Woodturner soceiety"

Mark Rand wrote "Ignorance is bliss! Without ever really thinking about the problem of gluing oily wood, I glued up some Coca Bola last year with Weldbond. This is a one part glue which is labeled "Universal Space Age Bonding Adhesive." I did not clean the surface of the wood and it had been at least a week since I cut the pieces. I also did not use a jointer since I don't have one. I had no problem with the glued sections. It turned on the lathe just fine.

The only problem I have had with this glue is sanding it off on the flat surface near the glue lines.

#### Grant Allison - Club historian

This article was in the May 1990 copy of "The Bay Area Woodturners Society" and the May 12, 1990 issue of the American Woodworker. This still holds true today. So read and take notice....

While a person was drilling a piece of wood laminate, the air near the person's face exploded. The reason was wood dust from the wood which was impregnated with phenolic resin was heated by the drill bit. The heat caused the explosion. The caution was to clear the air with a vacuum as you drill.

## Beginner/Novice classes to start in January

As we have talked about there is a need to some classes that teach basic turning skills. We have decided that the best way to accomplish this is to have Saturday sessions, running 9AM to roughly Noon once a month. Jim has graciously offered his shop to hold these, and we will be looking for volunteers to help with the instruction. A tenative proposal for these classes would be as shown below. The officers are discussing the proposal and may make some changes.

Jan 21st, 2005: Getting blanks from a log. This would cover things like how to use your chain saw, sealing the green blank for use later, bandsaw work, etc. While we are planning to make most classes hands on, this one will be limited. Bring ear and eye protection. If you have a chainsaw and would like us to inspect it, feel free to bring it.

Feb -- Sharpening. Bring your tools and eye protection. Plan to do hands on.

Mar -- Mounting blanks. This would include screw chucks, face plates, tape, glue, etc. Enough to get you going.

Apr -- Rough turning & seasoning wood. This includes taking the blank to a rough bowl, the "double turning", bowl savers, "drying wood".

May -- Finish turning of a bowl. Include green turning to completion, dry wood turning, sanding and finishing bottoms.

Hopefully this gives you an idea of what we are thinking, and we will be collecting suggestions for future classes. Such as, boxes, spindle turning, natural edge bowls, pens, miniatures, etc. Please drop an email to David Vannier (dsvannier@yahoo.com) if your are interested in these session as either a student or a possible instructor.
